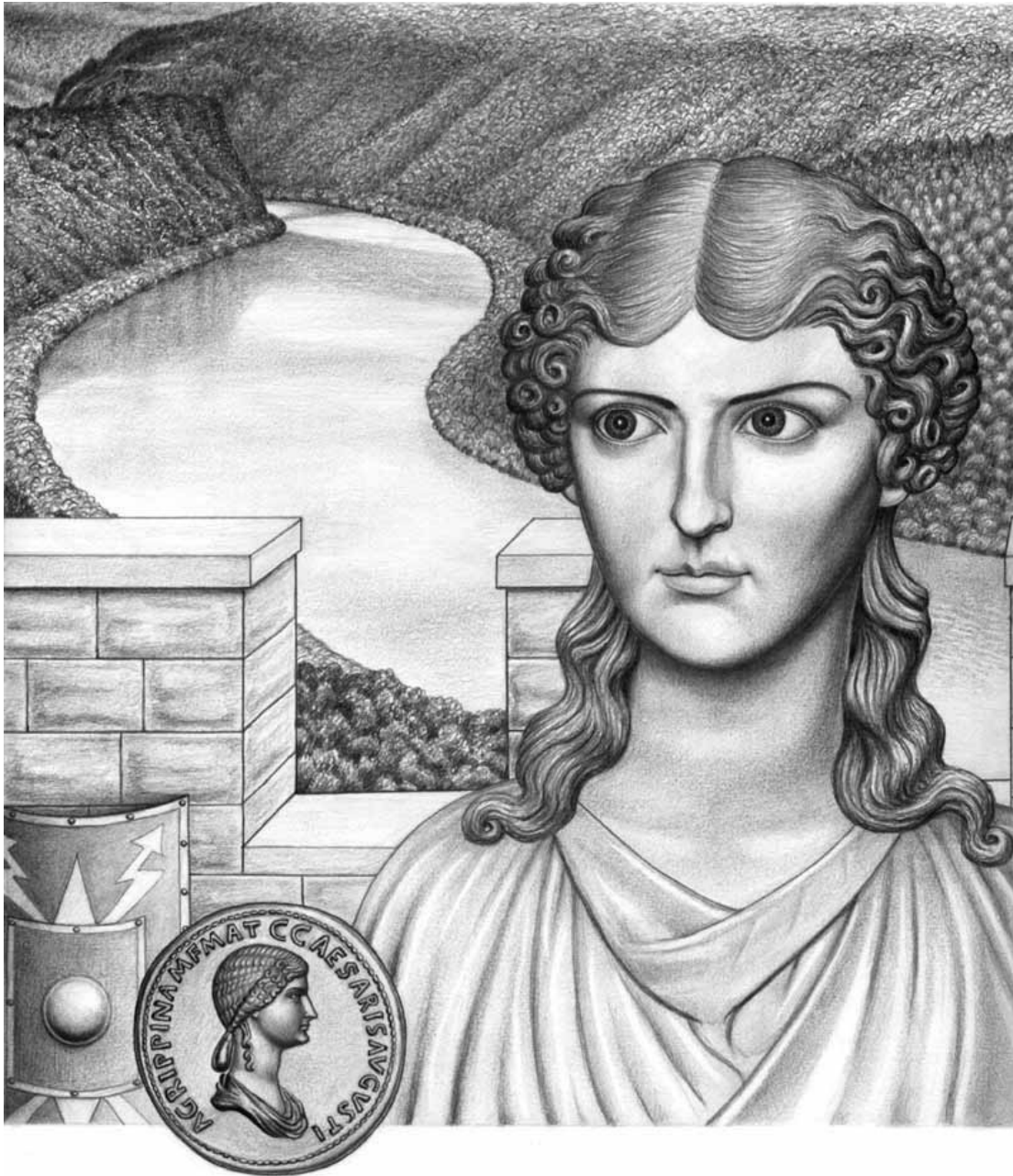


Hairstyle of Empress Agrippina the Elder

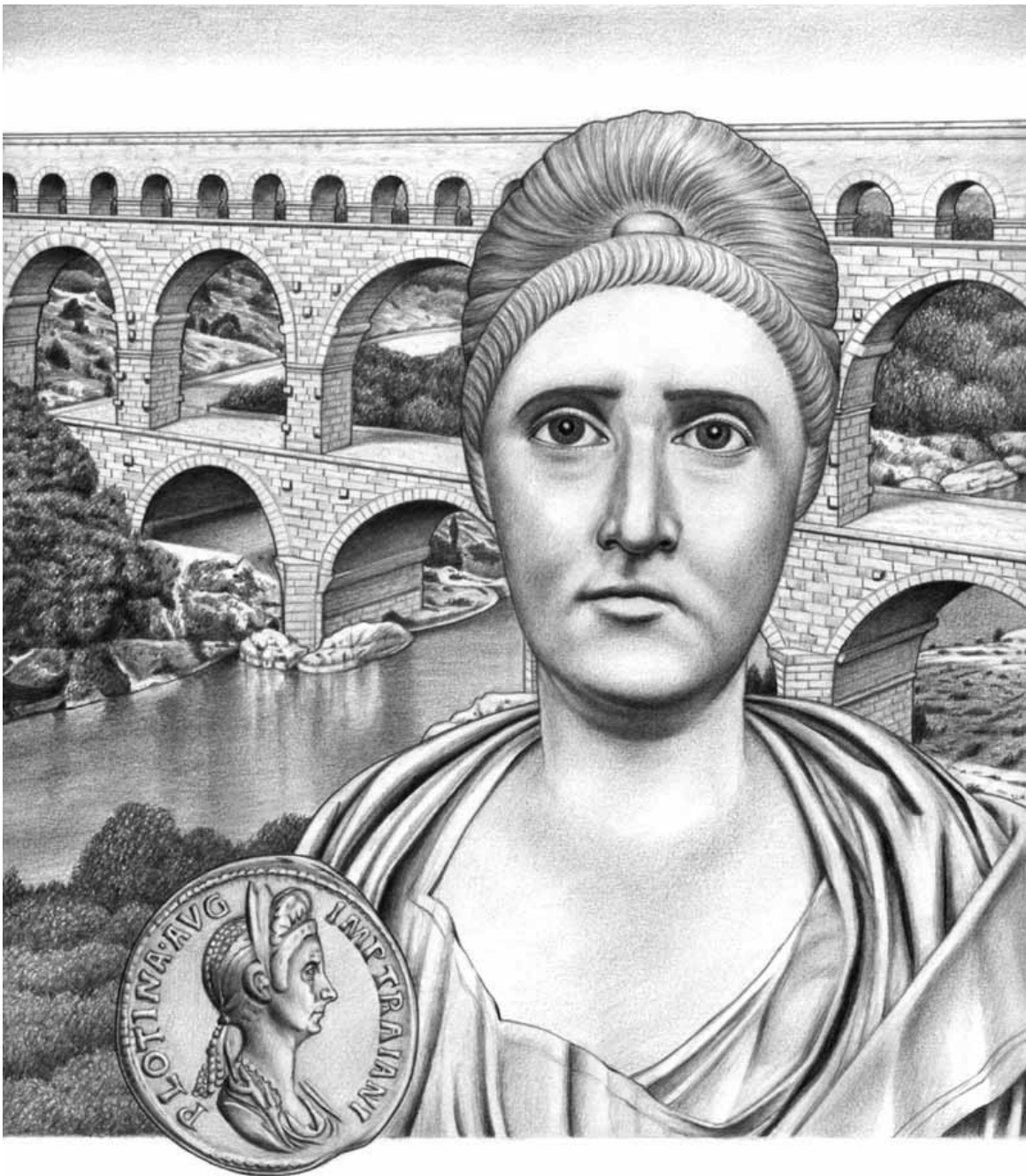
This style is BEST for CURLY HAIR.



Hairstyle of Empress Plotina

Born in Roman Gaul of provincial nobility, Plotina, wife of Emperor Trajan, was a virtuous, serious-minded woman of sober judgment, high moral standards, and intellectual capability. She was a supporter of the arts and a student of philosophy. This hairstyle is circa 2nd century CE.

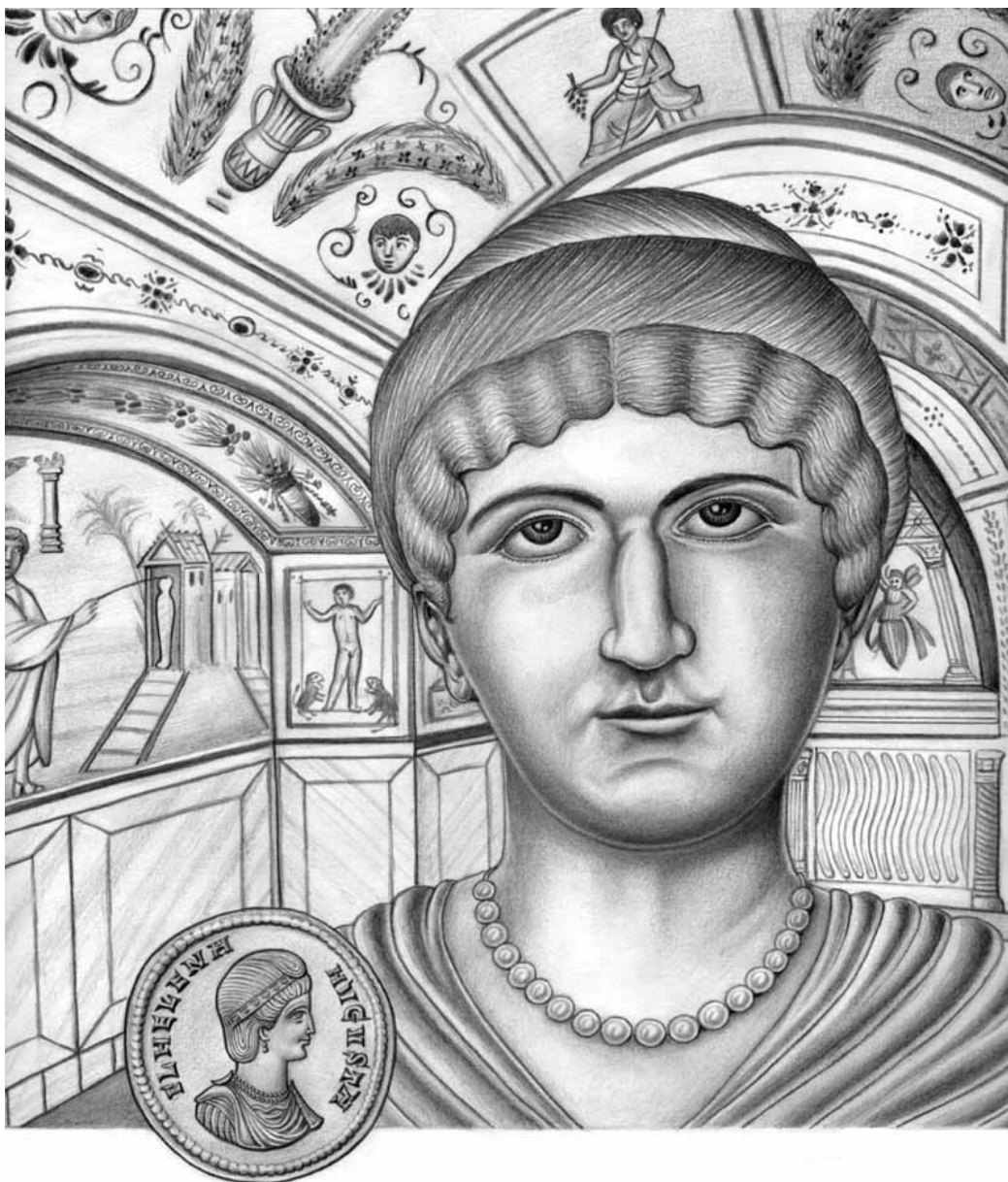
This style is BEST for STRAIGHT HAIR.



Hairstyle of Empress Helena

Born the lowest of commoners, Helena was the mother of Emperor Constantine the Great. She is an important figure in the the history of Christianity and of the world due to her influence on her son and her renowned piety. This hairstyle is circa 3rd century CE.

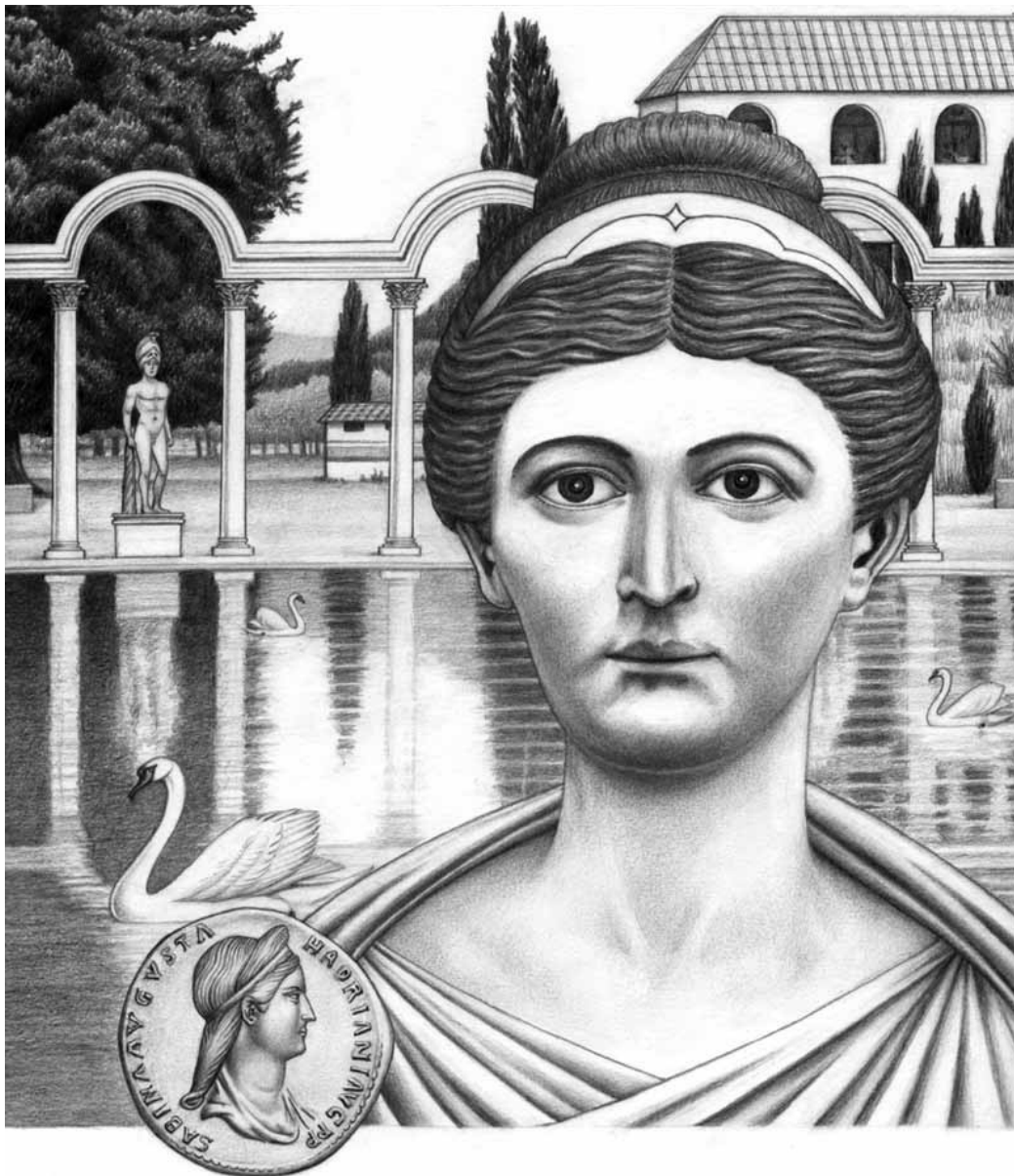
This style is BEST for SHORT HAIR.



Hairstyle of Empress Vibia Sabina

Sabina was wife to Emperor Hadrian. She had her own ideas about her marriage and how she should behave, which made her relationship with her husband tempestuous. This is one of her lesser-known hairstyles, which incorporates a circlet into the structure of the style. This hairstyle is circa 2nd century CE.

This style is BEST for LONG HAIR. Rigid circlet required.



Hairstyle of Empress Domitia Longina

The most popular style of the Flavian-Trajanic era, the "orbis comarum" ("circle of hair") coiffure was worn by Domitia Longina, wife of Emperor Domitian. This hairstyle is circa 1st century CE.

This style is BEST for ALL HAIR. False braids required.
